

for EXTERIOR body and trim

The painting of the exterior of your house divides itself into two main divisions: "body" color and "trim" color. These classifications can be defined as follows:

Body: The main walls of the building and all surfaces not specifically mentioned under trim are to be painted Body color.

Trim: Taking the house from the top of the chimney in order downward to the ground, trim is as follows—

CHIMNEY CAP: including entire top section.

STEEL COPING: That portion of the steel coping member above the top of the curve.

THE WINDOW SASH, bounded by the mastic joint at the top, the wall battens at the sides and the bottom of the copper drip at the sills. Sash trim includes the painted areas. Exterior color treatments on the windows should not extend beyond the glass line where they join interior treatments.

DOOR FRAMES are bounded by the mastic joint at the top, by the threshold at the bottom and by the wall battens at the side.

Exterior color treatment should not extend beyond the face of the door step square which the door abuts. Here the inside of the door is given the interior treatment.

DOORS can be painted trim color or body color.

The interior side of the door should cover the full edge of the door. The exterior of the door should cover the hinge side of the door.

SCREEN DOORS should be painted to match the exterior shade.

ALL TRELISES AND WINDOW BOXES furnished with the house are considered as trim and should be painted trim color.

The **ENTRANCE WOOD PANELS** look best when painted trim color underneath with blue color carried up to the metal drip on the edge of the roof. Another smart method of finishing the entrance is to paint the metal band in body color with a trim color door.

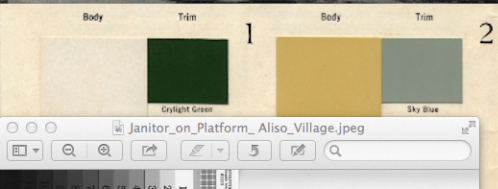
The **RAGE** band of the basement house should be painted body color. The treated base board of the "basement" leaves a dark brown color and should be left untreated.

THRESHOLDS, STEPS AND CONCRETE PLATFORMS should be left the natural color.
